## **Union Pacific Railroad Relocation South of Irving Park Road to North Contract Limits - O'Hare Modernization Program** *Addendum Issued*

The City of Chicago Department of Aviation has issued an Addendum on the following bid package:

Union Pacific Railroad Relocation South of Irving Park Road to North Contract Limits - O'Hare Modernization Program

Description: The Work consists of the construction of a new railroad over roadway grade separation structure for the re-aligned Union Pacific Railroad over Irving Park Road (IL 19), along with railroad embankment south and north of the bridge. The work also includes roadway work, site demolition, earth excavation/embankment, drainage ditches, culverts and sewers, erosion control, drainage, duct bank, and sub-ballast. Roadway Work includes reconstruction, widening, resurfacing, pavement marking, and temporary maintenance of traffic.

The program will reduce overall delays at the Airport by 79 percent, and bad weather delays by 95 percent. It will create 195,000 new jobs and \$18 billion in additional economic activity each year.
